#### LAKE EASU & GRAND LAKE LAKE LEVEL DISCUSSION

County Drain Commissioner Robert Macomber briefed the Board on conversations with Stacy Hissong of Fahey, Schultz, Burzych & Rhodes in regards to steps to take to create an assessment district in the Lake Esau and Grand Lake area.

Attorney Stacy Hissong appeared via telephone to answer questions of the Board.

#### **RESOLUTION**

#### **LAKE ESAU – LAKE LEVEL**

WHEREAS, Lake Esau, located in Presque Isle Township, Presque Isle County, Michigan has an established normal lake level by the Presque Isle County Circuit Court under Part 307 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, Act 451 of 1994, as amended ("Part 307"); and

WHEREAS, the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners and its delegated authority have jurisdiction for the operation and maintenance of the normal level of Lake Esau. MCL 324.30702; and

WHEREAS, Part 307's primary mechanism to fund infrastructure and activities to maintain and operate the normal level of Lake Esau is by special assessments using a lake level special assessment district established by the Presque Isle County Circuit Court. See e.g., MCL 324.30711; and

WHEREAS, a review of the historical court order relating to Lake Esau's normal level found that the prior order does not delineate the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district to fund maintenance of Lake Esau's normal level; and

WHEREAS, based on the facts above, the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners finds it necessary to: (1) approve hiring legal counsel and engineers to assist with the Part 307 lake level process, including filing a petition in the Presque Isle County Circuit Court; and (2) amend the lake level order for Lake Esau to allow for lake level variations, establish and confirm the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district, and conduct any other needed updates.

See MCL 324.30707(5) (circuit court has continuing jurisdiction).
- 2. Engineers. Presque Isle County may retain the engineering firm Spicer Group, Inc. to assist with activities related to maintenance and operation of the normal level of Lake Esau, including but not limited to preparation of studies and recommendations related to the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district and any other necessary updates to the lake level order; providing expert testimony related to the lake level order; and any other services deemed necessary by the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners or its delegated authority.
  - 3. Costs of Activities: All costs associated with the lake level activities authorized in this resolution, including retaining all necessary consultants (e.g., legal counsel and engineers), shall be reimbursed by a lake level special assessment district to the extent permitted by Part 307.

### **GRAND LAKE - LAKE LEVEL**

WHEREAS, Grand Lake, located in Krakow Township and Presque Isle Township, Presque Isle County, Michigan has an established normal lake level by the Presque Isle County Circuit

Court under Part 307 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, Act 451 of 1994, as amended ("Part 307"); and

WHEREAS, the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners and its delegated authority have jurisdiction for the operation and maintenance of the normal level of Grand Lake. MCL 324.30702; and

WHEREAS, Part 307's primary mechanism to fund infrastructure and activities to maintain and operate the normal level of Grand Lake is by special assessments using a lake level special assessment district established by the Presque Isle County Circuit Court. See e.g., MCL 324.30711; and

WHEREAS, a review of the historical court order relating to Grand Lake's normal level found that the prior order does not delineate the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district to fund maintenance of Grand Lake's normal level; and

WHEREAS, based on the facts above, the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners finds it necessary to: (1) approve hiring legal counsel and engineers to assist with the Part 307 lake level process, including filing a petition in the Presque Isle County Circuit Court; and (2) amend the lake level order for Grand Lake to allow for lake level variations, establish and confirm the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district, and conduct any other needed updates.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. Legal Counsel. Presque Isle County may retain legal counsel Fahey Schultz Burzych Rhodes PLC to assist with legal matters related to the Part 307 lake level process. Said legal counsel is explicitly authorized to file a petition in the Presque Isle County Circuit Court on behalf of Presque Isle County to allow for lake level variations, establish and confirm the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district, and conduct any other updates to the lake level order that are necessary to allow Presque Isle County to maintain and operate the normal lake level of Grand Lake. See MCL 324.30707(5) (circuit court has continuing jurisdiction).
- 2. Engineers. Presque Isle County may retain the engineering firm Spicer Group, Inc. to assist with activities related to maintenance and operation of the normal level of Grand Lake, including but not limited to preparation of studies and recommendations related to the boundaries of a lake level special assessment district and any other necessary updates to the lake level order; providing expert testimony related to the lake level order; and any other services deemed necessary by the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners or its delegated authority.
- 3. Costs of Activities: All costs associated with the lake level activities authorized in this resolution, including retaining all necessary consultants (e.g., legal counsel and engineers), shall be reimbursed by a lake level special assessment district to the extent permitted by Part 307.

# RESOLUTION TO BORROW AGAINST ANTICIPATED DELINQUENT 2023 REAL PROPERTY TAXES

Motion by Commissioner Darga and seconded by Commissioner Heidemann to adopt the following resolution;

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Presque Isle, State of Michigan, held at Rogers City, Michigan, on the 26th day of January, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Presque Isle (the "County") has heretofore adopted a resolution establishing the Presque Isle County Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund (the "Fund") pursuant to Section 87b of Act No. 206, Public Acts of Michigan, 1893, as amended ("Act 206"); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Fund is to allow the Presque Isle County Treasurer (the "County Treasurer") to pay from the Fund any or all delinquent real property taxes that are due and payable to the County, the State of Michigan and any school district, intermediate school district, community college district, city, township, special assessment district or other political unit for which delinquent tax payments are due; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined to be necessary for the County to borrow money and issue its notes for the purposes authorized by Act 206, particularly Sections 87c, 87d and 87g thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the total amount of unpaid 2023 delinquent real property taxes (the "delinquent taxes") outstanding on March 1, 2024, will be approximately \$1,700,000.00, exclusive of interest, fees and penalties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Presque Isle, State of Michigan, as follows:

## **Authorization of Borrowing**

1. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Act 206, Public Acts of Michigan, 1893, as amended, and especially Sections 87c, 87d and 87g thereof, the County shall borrow the sum of not to exceed One Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,700,000.00) and issue its notes (the "notes") therefor for the purpose of continuing the Fund for the 2023 tax year. The exact amount to be borrowed shall not exceed the amount of delinquent taxes outstanding on March 1, 2024, exclusive of interest, fees and penalties. The County Treasurer shall designate the exact amount to be borrowed after the amount of the 2023 delinquent taxes outstanding on March 1, 2024, or the portion of the 2023 delinquent taxes against which the County shall borrow, has been determined.

#### **Note Details**

2. Pursuant to provisions of applicable law and an order of the County Treasurer, which order is hereby authorized, the notes may be issued in one or more series; shall be known as "General Obligation Limited Tax Notes, Series 2024" with a letter designation added thereto if the notes are issued in more than one series; shall be in fully registered form in denominations not exceeding the aggregate principal amounts for each maturity of the notes; shall be sold for not less than 98% of the face amount of the notes; shall bear interest at fixed or variable rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate permitted by applicable law; shall be dated, payable as to

interest and in principal amounts, be subject to redemption in whole or in part prior to maturity. including any redemption premiums, and be subject to renewal, at such times and in such amounts, all as shall be designated in the order of the County Treasurer. Notes or portions of notes called for redemption shall not bear interest after the redemption date, provided funds are on hand with the note registrar and paying agent to redeem the same. Notice of redemption shall be given in the manner prescribed by the County Treasurer, including the number of days' notice of redemption and whether such notice shall be written or published, or both. If any notes of any series are to bear interest at a variable rate or rates, the County Treasurer is hereby further authorized to establish by order, and in accordance with law, a means by which interest on such notes may be set, reset or calculated prior to maturity, provided that such rate or rates shall at no time be in excess of the maximum interest rate permitted by applicable law. Such rates may be established by reference to the minimum rate that would be necessary to sell the notes at par; by a formula that is determined with respect to an index or indices of municipal obligations, reported prices or yields on obligations of the United States or the prime rate or rates of a bank or banks selected by the County Treasurer; or by any other method selected by the County Treasurer. If requested by the original purchaser of the notes and determined by the County Treasurer, the notes may be issued in the form of a single note with an exhibit containing the principal maturity amounts and applicable interest rates and due dates.

## Payment of Principal and Interest

3. The principal of and interest on the notes shall be payable in lawful money of the United States from such funds and accounts as provided herein. Principal shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of the notes to the note registrar and paying agent when and as the same shall become due, whether at maturity or earlier redemption; provided, however, if the notes are issued in the form of a single note, the County Treasurer may determine that presentation and surrender of the notes to the note registrar and paying agent is not required for

some or all principal installments, and, in such case, such principal installments shall be paid to the registered owner of the notes as shown on the registration books. Interest shall be paid to the owner shown as the registered owner on the registration books at the close of business on such date prior to the date such interest payment is due, as is provided in the order of the County Treasurer. Interest on the notes shall be paid when due by check, draft or as the County Treasurer otherwise determines by the note registrar and paying agent to the registered owner at the registered address, or by such other method as determined by the County Treasurer.

## Note Registrar and Paying Agent

4. The County Treasurer shall designate, and may enter into an agreement with, a note registrar and paying agent for each series of notes that shall be the County Treasurer or a bank or trust company that is qualified to act in such capacity under the laws of the United States of America or the State of Michigan. The County Treasurer may from time to time designate a similarly qualified successor note registrar and paying agent. Alternatively, the County Treasurer may serve as note registrar and paying agent if so designated by written order of the County Treasurer.

## Disposition of Note Proceeds

5. The proceeds of the sale of the notes shall be deposited into a separate account in the Fund and shall be used to continue the Fund. The County Treasurer shall pay therefrom and from unpledged funds in the Fund, uncommitted funds in the County General Fund and/or any other legally available funds, the full amount of the delinquent tax roll against which the County has borrowed, delivered as uncollected by any tax collector in the County and that is outstanding and unpaid on or after March 1, 2024, in accordance with the provisions of Act 206. If the notes are sold at a premium, the County Treasurer shall determine what portion of the premium, if any, shall be deposited in the 2024 Collection Account established in Section 6 hereof.

#### 2024 Collection Account

6. There is hereby established as part of the Fund an account (hereby designated the "2024 Collection Account") into which account the County Treasurer shall place delinquent taxes against which the County has borrowed, and interest thereon, collected on and after March 1, 2024, or such later date as determined by the County Treasurer, all County property tax administration fees on such delinquent taxes, after expenses of issuance of the notes have been paid, any premium as determined pursuant to Section 5 hereof, and any amounts received by the County Treasurer from the County, State of Michigan and any taxing unit within the County, because of the uncollectibility of such delinquent taxes. The foregoing are hereby established as funds pledged to note repayment. The County Treasurer shall designate the delinquent taxes against which the County shall borrow for each series of notes.

#### Note Reserve Fund

7. There is hereby authorized to be established by the County Treasurer a note reserve fund for the notes (the "2024 Note Reserve Fund") if the County Treasurer deems it to be reasonably required as a reserve and advisable in selling the notes at public or private sale. The County Treasurer is authorized to deposit in the 2024 Note Reserve Fund from proceeds of the sale of the notes, unpledged moneys in the Fund, uncommitted funds in the County General Fund and/or any other legally available funds, an amount not exceeding ten percent (10%) of the face amount of the notes.

## Security for Payment of Notes

8. All of the moneys in the 2024 Collection Account and the 2024 Note Reserve Fund, if established, and all interest earned thereon, relating to a series of notes are hereby pledged equally and ratably as to such series to the payment of the principal of and interest on the notes and shall be used solely for that purpose until such principal and interest have been paid in full. When moneys in the 2024 Note Reserve Fund, if established, are sufficient to pay the outstanding principal of the notes and the interest accrued thereon, such moneys may be used to retire the notes. If more than one series of notes is issued, the County Treasurer by order shall establish the priority of the funds pledged for payment of each such series. In such case the County Treasurer may establish sub-accounts in the various funds and accounts established pursuant to the terms of this resolution as may be necessary or appropriate.

## **Additional Security**

9. Each series of notes, in addition, shall be a general obligation of the County, secured by its full faith and credit, which shall include the County's limited tax obligation, within applicable constitutional and statutory limits, and its general funds. The County budget shall provide that if the pledged delinquent taxes and any other pledged amounts are not collected in sufficient amounts to meet the payments of principal and interest due on each series of notes, the County, before paying any other budgeted amounts, will promptly advance from its general funds sufficient moneys to pay that principal and interest. The County shall not have the power to impose taxes for payment of the notes in excess of constitutional or statutory limitations. If moneys in the 2024 Collection Account and the 2024 Note Reserve Fund, if established, are not sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the notes, when due, the County shall pay the same in accordance with this Section, and may thereafter reimburse itself from the delinquent taxes collected.

## Release of Pledge of 2024 Collection Account

10. Upon the investment of moneys in the 2024 Collection Account in direct non-callable obligations of the United States of America in amounts and with maturities that are sufficient to pay in full the principal of and interest on the notes when due, any moneys in the 2024 Collection Account thereafter remaining may be released from such pledge created pursuant to Section 8 hereof and may be used to pay any or all delinquent real property taxes that are due the County, the State of Michigan and any school district, intermediate school district, community college district, city, township, special assessment district or other political unit to which delinquent tax payments are due for any year or for any other purpose permitted by law.

#### Sale of Notes

11. The County Treasurer is hereby authorized to offer the notes at public or private sale as determined by order of the County Treasurer and to do all things necessary to effectuate the sale, delivery, transfer and exchange of the notes in accordance with the provisions of this resolution. Notes of one series may be offered for sale and sold separately from notes of another series. If the notes are to be sold publicly, sealed proposals for the purchase of the notes shall be received by the County Treasurer for such public sale to be held at such time as shall be determined by the County Treasurer and notice thereof shall be published in accordance with law once in The Bond Buyer, which is hereby designated as being a publication printed in the English language and circulated in this State that carries as a part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds. Such notice shall be in the form prescribed by the County Treasurer.

The County Treasurer is hereby authorized to cause the preparation of an official statement for the notes for the purpose of enabling compliance with SEC Rule 15c2-12 (the "Rule") and to do all other things necessary to enable compliance with the Rule. After the award of the notes, the County will provide copies of a final official statement (as defined in paragraph (f)(3) of the Rule) on a timely basis and in reasonable quantity as requested by the successful bidder or bidders to enable such successful bidder or bidders to comply with paragraphs (b)(3) and (b)(4) of the Rule and the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. The County Treasurer is authorized to enter into such agreements as may be required to enable the successful bidder or bidders to comply with the Rule.

## Continuing Disclosure

12. The County Treasurer is hereby authorized to execute and deliver in the name and on behalf of the County (i) a certificate of the County to comply with the requirements for a continuing disclosure undertaking of the County pursuant to paragraph (b)(5) or (d)(2) of the Rule, as applicable, and (ii) amendments to such certificate from time to time in accordance with the terms of such certificate (the certificate and any amendments thereto are collectively referred to herein as the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate"). The County hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate.

### **Execution and Delivery of Notes**

13. The County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to execute the notes for the County by manual or facsimile signature and the County Treasurer shall cause the County seal or a facsimile thereof to be impressed or imprinted on the notes. Unless the County Treasurer shall specify otherwise in writing, fully registered notes shall be authenticated by the manual signature of the note registrar and paying agent. After the notes have been executed and authenticated, if applicable, for delivery to the original purchaser thereof, the County Treasurer shall deliver the notes to the purchaser or purchasers thereof upon receipt of the purchase price. Additional notes bearing the manual or facsimile signature of the County Treasurer and upon which the seal of the County or a facsimile thereof is impressed or imprinted may be delivered to the note registrar and paying agent for authentication, if applicable, and delivery in connection with the exchange or transfer of fully registered notes. The note registrar and paying agent shall indicate on each note that it authenticates the date of its authentication. The notes shall be delivered with the approving legal opinion of Dickinson Wright PLLC.

## Exchange and Transfer of Fully Registered Notes

14. Any fully registered note, upon surrender thereof to the note registrar and paying agent with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the note registrar and paying agent duly executed by the registered owner or his or her duly authorized attorney, at the option of the registered owner thereof, may be exchanged for notes of any other authorized denominations of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity date and bearing the same rate of interest as the surrendered note.

Each note shall be transferable only upon the books of the County, which shall be kept for that purpose by the note registrar and paying agent, upon surrender of such note together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the note registrar and paying agent duly executed by the registered owner or his or her duly authorized attorney.

Upon the exchange or transfer of any note, the note registrar and paying agent on behalf of the County shall cancel the surrendered note and shall authenticate, if applicable, and deliver to the transferee a new note or notes of any authorized denomination of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity date and bearing the same rate of interest as the surrendered note. If, at the time the note registrar and paying agent authenticates, if applicable, and delivers a new note pursuant to this Section, payment of interest on the notes is in default, the note registrar and paying agent shall endorse upon the new note the following: "Payment of interest on this note is in default. The last date to which interest has been paid is [place date]."

The County and the note registrar and paying agent may deem and treat the person in whose name any note shall be registered upon the books of the County as the absolute owner of such note, whether such note shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of and interest on such note and for all other purposes, and all payments made to any such registered owner, or upon his or her order, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 hereof shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such note to the extent of the sum or sums so paid, and neither the County nor the note registrar and paying agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary. The County agrees to indemnify and save the note registrar and paying agent harmless from and against any and all loss, cost, charge, expense, judgment or liability incurred by it, acting in good faith and without negligence hereunder, in so treating such registered owner.

For every exchange or transfer of notes, the County or the note registrar and paying agent may make a charge sufficient to reimburse it for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer, which sum or sums shall be paid by the person requesting such exchange or transfer as a condition precedent to the exercise of the privilege of making such exchange or transfer.

The note registrar and paying agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange notes or portions of notes that have been selected for redemption.

## Book Entry System

15. At the option of the County Treasurer and notwithstanding any provisions of this resolution to the contrary, the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with a custodian or trustee for the purpose of establishing a "book entry" system for registration of notes to be fully registered. Pursuant to the provisions of such agreement, the notes may be registered in the name of the custodian or trustee for the benefit of other persons or entities. Such agreement shall provide for the keeping of accurate records and prompt transfer of funds by the custodian or trustee on behalf of such persons or entities. The agreement may provide for the issuance by the custodian or trustee of certificates evidencing beneficial ownership of the note by such persons or entities. For the purpose of payment of the principal of and interest on the notes, the County may deem payment of such principal and interest, whether overdue or not, to the custodian or trustee as payment to the absolute owner of such note. Pursuant to provisions of such agreement, the book entry system for the notes may be used for registration of all or a portion of the notes and such system may be discontinued at any time by the County. The note registrar and paying agent for the notes may act as custodian or trustee for such purposes.

Expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the notes, including without limitation any premiums for any insurance obtained for the notes, note rating agency fees, travel and printing expenses, fees for agreements for lines of credit, letters of credit, commitments to purchase the notes, remarketing agreements, reimbursement agreements, purchase or sales agreements or commitments, or agreements to provide security to assure timely payment of the notes, fees for the setting of interest rates on the notes and bond counsel, financial advisor, paying agent and registrar fees, all of which are hereby authorized, shall be paid by the County Treasurer from County property tax administration fees on the delinquent taxes, from any other moneys in the Fund not pledged to the repayment of notes and general funds of the County that are hereby authorized to be expended for that purpose.

#### Replacement of Notes

17. Upon receipt by the County Treasurer of satisfactory evidence that any outstanding note has been mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen, and of security or indemnity complying with applicable law and satisfactory to the County Treasurer, the County Treasurer may execute or authorize the imprinting of the County Treasurer's facsimile signature thereon and thereupon, and if applicable, a note registrar or paying agent shall authenticate and the County shall deliver a new note of like tenor as the note mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen.

Such new note shall be issued and delivered in exchange and substitution for, and upon surrender and cancellation of, the mutilated note or in lieu of and in substitution for the note so destroyed, lost or stolen in compliance with applicable law. For the replacement of authenticated notes, the note registrar and paying agent shall, for each new note authenticated and delivered as provided above, require the payment of expenses, including counsel fees, which may be incurred by the note registrar and paying agent and the County in the premises. Any note issued under the provisions of this Section in lieu of any note alleged to be destroyed, lost or stolen shall be on an equal basis with the note in substitution for which such note was issued.

## Chargebacks

18. For any principal payment date of the notes on or after January 1, 2027, the delinquent taxes on property foreclosed and sold pursuant to the provisions of Act 206 and against which the County has borrowed shall, if necessary to ensure full and timely payment of principal of and interest on the notes when due, be charged back to the taxing jurisdictions in such manner as determined by the County Treasurer. The proceeds of such chargebacks shall be deposited in the 2024 Collection Account as security for payment of the notes as described in Section 8 hereof. The provisions of this Section shall not limit the authority of the County Treasurer under the laws of the State of Michigan to charge back delinquent taxes under other circumstances or at other times.

## Purchase of Notes by County

19. All or any portion of the notes may be purchased or otherwise acquired by the County if the County Treasurer by order deems such purchase or acquisition to be in the best interest of the County. In such case, the County Treasurer is authorized to take such actions to effectuate the purchase or acquisition, including without limitation entering into an agreement to purchase or repurchase the notes. The purchase or other acquisition of notes by or on behalf of the County does not cancel, extinguish or otherwise affect the notes and the notes shall be treated as outstanding notes for all purposes of this resolution until paid in full.

## Issuance of Refunding Notes

20. The County shall refund all or part of the notes authorized hereunder and/or notes previously issued by the County to continue the Fund for prior tax years if and as authorized by order of the County Treasurer through the issuance of refunding notes (the "Refunding Notes") in an amount to be determined by order of the County Treasurer. Proceeds of the Refunding Notes may be used to redeem such notes and to pay issuance expenses of the Refunding Notes as authorized and described in Section 16 hereof. The County Treasurer shall have all the authority with respect to the Refunding Notes as is granted to the County Treasurer with respect to the notes by the other Sections hereof, including the authority to select a note registrar and paying agent, to apply to the Michigan Department of Treasury for approval to issue the Refunding Notes, if necessary, to cause the preparation of an official statement and to do all other things necessary to sell, execute and deliver the Refunding Notes. The Refunding Notes shall contain the provisions, shall be payable as to principal and interest and shall be secured as set forth herein and as further ordered by the County Treasurer. The Refunding Notes may be sold as a separate issue or may be combined in a single issue with other obligations of the County issued pursuant to the provisions of Act 206 as shall be determined by the County Treasurer. The County Treasurer is authorized to prescribe the form of Refunding Note and the form of notice of sale, if any, for the sale of Refunding Notes.

21. The notes shall be in the form approved by the County Treasurer, which approval shall be evidenced by the County Treasurer's execution thereof.

This proposal is for a renewal millage and will permit the County to levy up to 0.33 mills (\$0.33 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation) to provide funds for operating and maintaining school resource officer positions in Presque Isle County Public Schools.

Shall the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on the amount of ad valorem taxes which may be imposed by the County of Presque Isle, State of Michigan, against taxable property in the County be increased by 0.33 mills (\$0.33 per \$1,000 of taxable value) on the taxable value of such property for a period of four (4) years, 2024 through 2027, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds to operate and maintain school resource officer positions in Presque Isle County Public Schools, and shall the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners be authorized to levy such millage for these purposes? If approved and levied in its entirety, this millage would raise an estimated \$294,546.64 for Presque Isle County in 2024.

Note: If approved and levied, in accordance with State Law, a portion of this millage collected on certain properties lying within established Downtown Development Districts will be captured by or disbursed to the Downtown Development Authorities of the cities of Rogers City and Onaway for authorized purposes. The amount of such capture is estimated to be \$1,463.71 in the first year of the levy.

# RESOLUTION COUNCIL ON AGING TRANSPORTATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL

WHEREAS, the County of Presque Isle wishes to provide transportation services for older persons within Presque Isle County; and

WHEREAS, counties may submit a millage proposition to the electorate as authorized by Public Act 39 of 1976 to levy up to 1 mill for services to older citizens; and

# PRESQUE ISLE COUNTY COUNCIL ON AGING TRANSPORTATION MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will authorize the County of Presque Isle to levy 0.25 mill for the purpose of funding the Presque Isle County Council on Aging transportation program. Of the 0.25 mill, 0.2490 represents a renewal of the 0.25 mill approved by the electors in 2018, which expired with the 2023 levy and 0.0010 represents a restoration of that portion of the previously voted 0.25 mill which was reduced by the application of the Headlee Amendment.

Shall the expired previous voted increase in the tax limitations imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Presque Isle County, of 0.25 mill (\$0.25 per \$1000 of taxable value), reduced to 0.2490 mill (\$0.2490 per \$1000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at and increased up to the original voted 0.25 mill (\$0.25 per \$1000 of taxable value) and levied for 5 years, 2024 through 2028, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funding for the Presque Isle County Council on Aging transportation program, raising approximately \$223,140.00 in the first year the millage is levied.

Note: If approved and levied, in accordance with State Law, a portion of the renewal from this millage collected on certain properties lying within established Downtown Development Districts will be captured by or disbursed to the Downtown Development Authorities of the City of Rogers City and the City of Onaway for authorized purposes. The amount of such capture is estimated to be \$738.51 in the first year of the levy.

## RESOLUTION FOR CONSERVATION DISTRICT

RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO THE FY 2025 GOVERNOR'S RECOMMENDED BUDGET FOR THE REDUCTION OF OPERATIONAL FUNDING TO THE MICHIGAN CONSERVATION DISTRICTS AND THE ELIMINATION OF LOCAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE MICHIGAN AGRICULTURE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSURANCE PROGRAM (MAEAP)

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2024, Governor Whitmer released her Executive Budget Recommendation for fiscal year 2025 which included under the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) recommended budget a \$1,000,000.00 cut to Michigan Conservation District's operating budget.

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2025 budget recommendation for MDARD also recommended the termination of local Conservation District Technicians who administer the Michigan Agriculture Environmental Assurance Program and replace them with 24 State employees.

WHEREAS, this recommendation undermines the local conservation delivery system led by local Conservation Districts covering all 83 Michigan counties using the voluntary, non-regulatory, educational approach used all across the country to address natural resources concerns at the local level.

WHEREAS, Michigan passed Public Act 297 of 1937 to establish Conservation Districts as local units of State Government to work with landowners in every county to address natural resource concerns driven by a five-member publicly-elected Board of Directors. These Boards establish conservation priorities based on their local needs and voluntarily work with landowners to address critical natural resource concerns, the only organization that can do this on private land with the trust of the landowner.

WHEREAS, Michigan Conservation Districts have been critically underfunded for decades, leading many Conservation Districts without staff to implement programs or provide assistance; because of this, Michigan Conservation Districts experience high employee turnover which undermines the success of programs and the ability to administer assistance to the public.

WHEREAS, Michigan cannot effectively allocate federal funds from the Inflation Reduction Act and Title II of the Farm Bill due to the lack of funding provided by the State of Michigan. This leaves critical federal dollars on the table that are reallocated to other States that can deliver Farm Bill dollars more effectively.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Presque Isle requests that the FY 2025 budget maintain the operational budget for Michigan Conservation Districts at \$3,000,000.00 and maintain the Michigan Agriculture Environmental Assurance Program (MAEAP) at its current capacity with local technicians employed by Conservation Districts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county of Presque Isle implores the legislature to properly fund Michigan Conservation Districts and work with MDARD and the Michigan Association of Conservation Districts (MACD) to find or develop a restricted funding source to provide Conservation District's with a yearly allocation of \$13,000,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be provided to Governor Gretchen Whitmer, Senators John DaMoose and Ed McBroom, Representatives David Prestin and Niel Friske as well as the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development Director Tim Boring and Deputy Director Kathy Angerer and the Michigan Association of Counties.

# PROCLAMATION FAMILY COURT AWARENESS MONTH

**WHEREAS**, the mission of Family Court Awareness Month (FCAM) is to raise awareness about the importance of a family court system that prioritizes child safety and acts in the best interests of children. FCAM also aims to improve recognition among court professionals, legislators, and the public that family court decisions have profound and lasting impacts on the lives of children and families, making it essential that these decisions are informed by the latest research and best practices in child safety;

**WHEREAS**, an estimated 58,000 children in the U.S. are ordered into unsupervised contact with abusive parents each year, resulting in hundreds of child murders during visitation with a dangerous parent. In Michigan, 39 children have been killed by a parent since 2008 during divorce or custody disputes;

**WHEREAS**, in August 2024, 6-year-old Rowan Morey of Caledonia, Michigan, was not returned to his mother after his father's parenting time. A search led police to discover that Rowan had been shot and killed by his father, who then took his own life. Rowan's mother had previously reported the father's abusive behavior to both family court and Child Protective Services;

**WHEREAS**, in August 2022, 16-month-old Chaos Demilo McCarthy was murdered by his father in Genesee County. A Genesee County judge had awarded the father temporary custody just weeks before the boy's death, despite the father's prior felony conviction;

**WHEREAS**, in September 2021, 3-year-old Dylan Thebo was fatally shot by his father in a murder-suicide during court-ordered visitation in Kent County. Dylan's mother had made repeated efforts to report her ex-husband's abuse and threats to six different entities;

**WHEREAS**, in 2015, the Tsimhoni children's abuse claims were dismissed by the Oakland County Family Court, and the children were sent to juvenile hall for resisting visitation with their father. Controversial reunification therapy was ordered, which mandates reconciliation with alleged abusers. This therapy, which is not evidence-based, has been shown to be detrimental and despite findings of judicial misconduct in the case, reunification therapy is still frequently ordered by family courts;

**WHEREAS**, Kent County, Michigan, following six domestic violence-related homicides within three months in 2021, recognized the need for a specialized Domestic Violence Court. This court, staffed by individuals knowledgeable about the intricacies of domestic violence, aims to support victims and families, hold offenders accountable, and prevent further homicides;

**WHEREAS**, the mission of Family Court Awareness Month (FCAM) is to promote judicial education and awareness about the necessity of using scientifically validated, evidence-based treatment programs that are proven to be safe and effective. This education should include training on domestic violence, child abuse (emotional, psychological, physical, and sexual), childhood trauma, coercive control, and post-separation abuse for judges and all professionals involved in family court cases;

WHEREAS, FCAM is dedicated to educating judges and family court professionals on the importance of incorporating evidence-based, peer-reviewed research into their decision-making. This includes the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) Study (Vincent Felitti, Kaiser Permanente-CDC), Child Custody Evaluators' Beliefs About Domestic Abuse Allegations (Daniel Saunders, University of Michigan), and Child Custody Outcomes in Cases Involving Parental Alienation and Abuse Allegations (Joan S. Meier, GW Law School). This research reveals a prevalent gender bias against mothers who report abuse in family courts, despite false allegations being rare, and emphasizes the need for impartial decision-making to protect children's well-being;

**WHEREAS**, Family Court Awareness Month aims to encourage collaboration among legislators, advocates, professionals, and the community to improve family court practices, ensuring they are guided by evidence-based research and prioritize the safety and best interests of children;

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the Presque Isle County Board of Commissioners hereby declare the Month of NOVEMBER to be FAMILY COURT AWARENESS MONTH.
